


MEMBERSHIP CARDS

In October 2015 **At Home In Darien** announced a NEW membership card program and provided all Darien seniors with a FREE membership card. 3,436 Darien residents, 60 years of age or older - who are automatically a member of **At Home In Darien** - received a personalized membership card by mail. The card provides access to discounts and promotions at local businesses and shops in town, priority sign in for special events hosted by **At Home In Darien**, and **At Home In Darien** contact information at one’s fingertips. New promotions are regularly added and are advertised on our website and in our Monthly Calendar of Events.

SENIOR SURVEY

In April 2015 we mailed a survey to Darien seniors and the 297 Darien seniors who responded provided candid feedback, important information, and more than 325 comments! We learned about the senior services they desire, their future plans, how they want to get information, what they think of our services, and their involvement in town.



MONTHLY CALENDAR OF EVENTS



In response to our April 2015 senior survey we learned that while 26% of respondents want to receive our Monthly Calendar of Events on-line, 65% want to receive it by regular postal service. The June Calendar of Events was the first issue mailed by post to all of those respondents who requested it. We continue to mail (and email) this central source of information regarding opportunities, events and news consolidated from many organizations each month, with our last 2015 issue reaching 195 by mail and 946 by email.

OUR NEW WHEELS

At Home In Darien is driving a new Chrysler 300, four-door, all-wheel drive sedan thanks to the **Darien Foundation for Technology & Community** and their charitable donors who provided funding for this beautiful new vehicle. The new car replaces an aging sedan and allows Darien residents to travel in style, in a safe, comfortable, fuel efficient vehicle.

HOME SAFETY EVALUATIONS



This year **At Home In Darien** launched a program with **Family & Children’s Agency** to offer free in-home Fall Safety Prevention Evaluations to Darien seniors. This valuable professional assessment of the home is critical to living safely at home. It opens an essential discussion of potential hazards in the home and how a fall can be prevented. Ten individuals took advantage of the program in 2015 and we encourage more to do so in the future!

SERVICES BY THE NUMBERS

- **3,130 door-to-door rides**, including those for **103** first-time riders!
- **1,182 calls** for advice and assistance.
- **1,707 hands on volunteer hours** - a **59% increase** over 2014.
- **251 referrals** made to vetted service providers.

A LOOK AT OUR FINANCES

At Home In Darien's financial condition remains healthy and stable. The majority of our funding comes from private donations from members of the Darien community. We thoughtfully and responsibly spend funds to provide free services and assistance to benefit Darien seniors so that they can continue living independently at home and be socially engaged in our community.

AT HOME IN DARIEN IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE:

Connecticut has the tenth oldest population in the U.S. with 679,000 over the age of 60.

Darien has 3,436 persons over 60 ... 16% of the town population which is higher than the national average of 13%. This is expected to reach 20% by the next decade.

The population group 85+ will double by 2030.

89% of Darien residents want to remain in their home as they age.

It is significantly less expensive for one to be cared for in their own home, as compared to a care facility.



OUR KEY SERVICES

FREE OF CHARGE, WHICH ASSIST SENIORS TO AGE IN PLACE:

Professional drivers provide door to door transportation by sedan or handicap accessible minivan, within Darien, Stamford, Norwalk and New Canaan weekdays between 9am and 4pm.

Trustworthy volunteers:

- Assist with rides to appointments outside of our service area or hours.
- Provide ongoing companionship and support with in-home visits.
- Grocery shop or run errands for homebound seniors.
- Help take care of small tasks in a senior’s home.
- Clear snow off public sidewalks and rake leaves from a senior’s lawn.

Advice and resources to seniors and their families by connecting them to assistance in the community.

Referrals to vetted health and home care professionals, and property and home maintenance services giving seniors reliable references and peace of mind.

The Out & About newsletter mailed three times a year to every mailbox in Darien, full of valuable information of interest to seniors and their loved ones.

A Monthly Calendar of Events, sharing information from many organizations regarding community opportunities, events and news, sent each month via email or regular mail.

Social, educational, wellness programs in collaboration with other local organizations.

Membership cards entitling seniors to discounts at numerous local businesses.






