What is a Vetted Service Provider?



Ever need something done around the home, but don't feel up to the job or don't have a friend or neighbor to make a good recommendation?

Call Aging in Place+Gallivant for referral to someone you can trust!

Our service providers are people you hire to do jobs around your home. Often we've negotiated a senior discount that you can take advantage of by mentioning we referred you to them.

We make sure the service provider is someone you can trust to be in your home and do a good job at a fair price. How do we do that? Our vetting process consists of the following:

- Service provider completes an application.
- Certificates of liability insurance and any State required licenses are reviewed.
- Licenses and complaint history are checked with the State Department of Consumer Protection.
- The State Judicial Branch is checked for any small claims history.
- References are contacted and the service provider is interviewed.

We have providers who can help with carpentry, computers, cleaning air ducts, dump runs, electrical needs, landscaping, gutters, plumbing, locks, masonry, chimney cleaning, moving, organizing, odd jobs, and more. Our list is continually updated and growing. If you have a good referral, please share it with us!

Darien EMS Post 53

ost 53 is Darien's all volunteer ambulance corps. Fully staffed and equipped ambulances are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. With our fully trained corps of volunteers, Stamford paramedics when necessary, and first responders the Darien police and fire departments, you can expect excellent pre-hospital medical care. Dialing 911 activates an emergency response. For a medical emergency,



trained medical dispatchers will direct the Darien Police, Darien EMS and Stamford Paramedics, based on the nature of your call, to your address.

New this year, Post 53 is providing households with Medical Emergency Fact cards (MED cards) to have available when the ambulance arrives. This information, such as past medical history, medications, allergies, etc. can be very helpful in medical emergencies.

If you have your MED card filled out you will be providing first responders accurate, timely information.

In addition, Post 53 offers free blood pressure screenings on Sundays at Post 53 headquarters from noon to 2:00pm. Post 53 also offers training and certification classes in first aid, CPR and AED use. Darien EMS Post 53 and its highly trained volunteers are proud to serve you, offering excellence in prehospital medical care.

re than ever, people are leading active lives well into their "golden years." At the same time, many people over the age of 65 struggle with chronic illness and isolation issues. To meet the diverse needs of the aging community, Family Centers

offers an array of services that encourage lifelong learning, socialization and support.

Friendly Connections: Friendly Connections offers an array of senior outreach services including workshops and support groups that enhance socialization and educational opportunities for adults living in lower Fairfield County. Home visitation, teleconference courses and groups, needs assessments and call-in services are also available for seniors who are homebound.

Counseling and Support: Family Centers provides a variety of individual, couples and group counseling services on topics ranging from wellness to isolation issues. Services are offered at Family Centers' offices, senior centers or residential facilities and are available by appointment.

Onsite Supportive Services: Family Centers' team of Resident Service Coordinators provides

onsite supportive services to aging adults living in subsidized housing in lower Fairfield County.

Senior Health Counseling Insurance Program (SHIP): The SHIP Program helps older adults understand the complexities of their health care plans. Assistance is offered on Medicare Part D, Medigap and long-term care insurance.


Our agency also offers stateof-the art "home telehealth. a special technology which enables patients to engage with a registered nurse in real-time using an in-home telemonitoring system.

YWCA

WCA Darien/Norwalk offers senior women age 60 and over a discounted membership of \$35 per year to take advantage of our members-only activities. The membership year runs from July 1st through June 30th and women can join by visiting our website or our office.



Bodyworks with Suzanne McCollum is just one of the programs that seniors can enjoy at the YWCA. Suzanne offers a variety of workouts for all fitness levels including Step & Sculpt, Aerobic Combo, Interval Training, and Ball workouts. Her classes meet Wednesdays & Fridays from 8am-9am and members pay \$132 for 12 weeks of classes.

Another program that might be of interest is our Spring gardening classes, led by local landscape designer Sara McCool. Classes include Landscape Design and Practice, a 5-week class which includes a personal consultation as part of the class fee. Classes are available on either a weeknight or morning and members pay \$95 for the five 1.5

hour sessions. Sara also offers one-session classes of Perennial Garden and Outdoor Green Garden, each on a Saturday morning for \$20 for members. See our website for details under "Partner Classes for Adults".

AARP

The vast majority of older adults want to age in place, so they can continue to live in their own homes or communities. At **AARP**, we understand this desire and have worked at

ifetime Learners Institute (LLI) is an independent nonprofit institute for lifelong learning within Norwalk Community College. Our purpose is to offer non-credit, educational programs for area residents aged 50 or older. We offer over 40 courses each Spring and Fall, taught by LLI facilitators, as well as daily events during a



five-week Winter Session. The volunteer run institute has almost 1000 members from all over Fairfield County.

Lifetime Learners Institute has announced the Fall 2012 schedule of classes, most starting the week of September 10th. Over 50 two-hour daytime classes include: History, Language, the Arts, Literature, Music, Health, Opera, Sports, Movie Clips, Mysteries, Books, Computers, Memoirs, Current Events, and more - something for everyone!

Detailed course catalogs are mailed to members. If you are interested in receiving a copy, you can request one be sent by mail, or stop by the College's West Campus room W120 any weekday before 1:00pm to obtain a copy and ask questions. You can also find the Course Catalog on the web site.

You can select up to two classes for each day, Monday through Thursday afternoons or Friday mornings. Also, on most Fridays there is a "Brown Bag Lunch & Learn" program that includes a noontime social hour with refreshments, followed by a guest

presentation. These Friday afternoon programs are free to all LLI members, as is the use of the College's Fitness Center. Annual 12-month memberships are \$40.00. All courses cost only \$25.00 each for a 4 to 8 week class session. Join and enjoy learning, without stress or tests!
