Anniversaries are a celebration—even for nonprofit organizations.



Did you know you can use your IRA to make a donation and reduce your taxes?

Retirees with certain IRA accounts must begin withdrawals when they reach 70½ years of age or older. These Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) are taxed as ordinary income and must be taken to avoid a penalty. Transferring money from your IRA to a qualifying charity (in lieu of taking an RMD) can be a tax-efficient way of meeting this requirement and satisfying your charitable giving objectives. This is known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). You can find additional information about QCD's and donating to At Home In Darien on our website. AT HOME IN DARIEN **HISTORY**

Prior to 2009, several groups endeavored to bring the AGING IN PLACE concept to Darien. Aging in place is a term used to describe people living in the residence of their choice as they age for as long as they are able.

With collaboration, research, assessment, and planning, a pilot program funded by The Community Fund of Darien was formed in 2009. The organization, named Aging in Place in Darien, began offering services and helping residents to remain at home in Darien.

Gallivant also served the older

adults of Darien providing transportation to Darien seniors. The two organizations merged in 2011 to create Aging in Place+Gallivant, an independent, charitable, nonprofit organization.

In 2013, the Aging in Place+Gallivant Board of Directors

renamed the organization At Home In Darien to more clearly communicate its mission of helping Darien seniors live independently, comfortably and with dignity in their own homes.

Over the past 10 years, services have been expanded, and new ones have been added, in order to meet the needs of Darien's growing senior population.

Prior to 2009 several groups (including the First Congregational Church of Darien's Women's Association, Darien Human Services, and the Human Services Planning Council) endeavored to bring the AGING IN PLACE concept to Darien. All those interested collaborated to research, assess, and plan, which culminated in a pilot program funded by The Community Fund of Darien, which became At Home In Darien.
