Look who's connected to At Home In Darien



Jane has lived in Darien for the past 8 years after moving here to help care for her granddaughters. Although she planned to stay for just a year, she still lives in Darien, because she's such a fan! Previously from the Princeton, New Jersey area, Jane was Director of Sales and Marketing for a residential real estate company. She is a first-generation Irish-American and the oldest of 7 children.

Jane learned about **At Home In Darien** through her volunteer work at the Darien Community Association Thrift Shop. She began volunteering as a driver with **At Home In Darien**, because once she got to her late 60s, "I realized I had the time to give back to the community and do what I think is important." Jane also became the volunteer coordinator for

At Home In Darien's walking club, the Darien Steppers, and continues to lead walks several times per week.

When **At Home In Darien** needed to hire another driver because ride requests were increasing, Jane was a natural choice. Jane says that her work is important not only to riders, but is also important to their family members. **At Home In Darien** makes it easier for adult children to take care of their aging parents. Jane enjoys providing a reliable and safe transportation experience that people depend on, whether it be a trip to the doctor, shopping mall, or grocery store. Jane's favorite aspect of being a driver is listening to people's life stories. According to Jane, "Drivers are like a neutral sounding board. Riders will often tell me more about their life than they would their own children!"

Jane praised the safety procedures that were put in place due to COVID-19 to keep riders both safe and comfortable. Disinfectant, hand sanitizer, and a full car wipe down have become a regular part of the transportation routine. Temperatures are checked and masks are worn on every ride. "**At Home In Darien** has gone above and beyond to ensure everyone's safety."

Outside of work, Jane loves gardening and even has a plot at the community gardening center. She is also very involved in her grandchildren's lives who are 8 and 9.

Jeff grew up in Rochester, New York and came to Darien in 1969. He and his wife love Darien and their three children were born and raised here. Jeff retired 8 years ago and since then has been a volunteer teacher, mentor, and a pro bono consultant for small businesses. He enjoys spending time with his friends and family and playing golf.

Jeff found out about **At Home In Darien** through a friend of his wife's who was involved as a volunteer. He certainly did not foresee himself needing the services in the immediate future. Unfortunately he slipped on black ice and ruptured his patella tendon on Christmas Eve 2019. After being told by his doctor that he couldn't drive for 4 months, he thought he was going to go crazy. However, he soon realized he could use **At Home In Darien** for rides. During those months, the ride service gave him the freedom to keep active and enjoy Darien.

Jeff had "fantastic experiences with the drivers" and described the service as a "lifesaver." Jeff has recovered from his injury and is now back on the golf course. Jeff is grateful for the help he received during his recuperation.





Ines has lived in Darien for 42 years, but is getting ready to move to Long Island to be closer to family. After her husband was no longer able to drive, Ines needed reliable transportation. "At Home In Darien has been a lifesaver" taking her to the doctor and grocery store in a safe and comfortable vehicle. Ines says that At Home In Darien has helped her and her sister maintain an independent lifestyle. Ines remarked that taking a taxi every time she wanted to go somewhere was too inconvenient and much too expensive.

Marti was born in Ohio, and after her 4 children were also born there, her family moved quite a bit and lived in New Jersey, Virginia, Texas, and Missouri. She has lived in Darien for part of the year since 2004, and moved to town full-time two years ago. Marti is done moving and is in Darien to stay!

Her 4 children have given her 12 grandchildren and when she isn't babysitting for them, she finds time to volunteer. She volunteered for the Red Cross before finding **At Home In Darien**. Marti started volunteering as a "friendly visitor" about three years ago. **Fran** has lived in Darien her entire life and her 82-year-old father **Bob**, has lived in Darien for 60 years. He served in the Army Reserve as a sergeant, was a sheet metal worker, and later became the Superintendent of Sewers in Darien. Bob has been very active in the community with the Boy Scouts, Youth Hockey, the Rotary Club, the Sewer Commission, and St. Thomas More Church. Fran followed in her father's footsteps by serving 7 years in the Army Reserve National Guard. As an adult child of a senior, Fran takes care of many details of her dad's life.

Unfortunately, Bob became wheelchair bound after a car accident 2 years ago, which lead him to begin using **At Home In Darien** for transportation. Fran describes how the services are not only a great help for her father, but also for the entire family. "**At Home In Darien** has been amazing, the people are amazing — the drivers are amazing.



It's a well-oiled machine that is a godsend and total lifesaver for us."

Wheelchair transportation can be expensive and often times is inconvenient. According to Fran, "We would have to pay \$50 to \$150 per ride for wheel-chair accessible transportation to get [her] dad to the doctor." **At Home In Darien** has been an incredible solution to their transportation needs.

Due to COVID-19, her volunteer role has changed and expanded. Currently, Marti primarily does grocery shopping and driving. Marti says that she "enjoys being able to help people" and that "**At Home In Darien** is such a positive organization that enables so many people to stay in their home."

Marti is fascinated with each senior's background and life story. Marti noted that **At Home In Darien** has adapted very well to COVID-19 by ensuring client safety and responding to changing service demands such as a greater need for grocery delivery.

Marti is not only kind and compassionate, but she is a dedicated and outstanding volunteer. Recently, **At Home In Darien** was in a pinch trying to accommodate a ride request and called upon Marti who quickly and happily agreed to help. Her senior passenger said she had a thoroughly enjoyable time with Marti behind the wheel and appreciated her assistance and the friendship!

Fran also gives high praise to the marvelous service, and appreciates that **At Home In Darien** often times coordinates last-minute rides for urgent doctor's visits despite a busy schedule. **At Home In Darien** has helped to improve the lives of Fran and Bob because of the dedicated employees and generous donors that make services possible.

TAXI ANYONE?

At Home In Darien transportation services are safe and trustworthy, but are available only on weekdays. Our Half-Price Taxi Voucher Program allows you to arrange transportation for yourself on-demand, around the clock, 365 days a year! Taxi rides are 50% off the regular price for Darien seniors 60+ and residents with disabilities. For example, a booklet of taxi vouchers worth \$25 is available for purchase for only \$12.50. Simply pay the taxi driver with your vouchers.

More than 50 Darien residents currently take advantage of this program!

To purchase vouchers, residents must bring proof of age or disability. Please call **At Home In Darien** at **203.655.2227**, or stop by the office at 2 Renshaw Road, for more information.

Did you know you can use your IRA to make a donation and reduce your taxes?

Retirees with certain IRA accounts must begin withdrawals when they reach 70½ years of age or older. These Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) are taxed as ordinary income and must be taken to avoid a penalty. Transferring money from your IRA to a qualifying charity (in lieu of taking an RMD) can be a tax-efficient way of meeting this requirement and satisfying your charitable giving objectives.
