In spite of the unusual heat, **At Home In Darien** has had a very busy and productive summer. Since the last Out & About issue, our most significant news is the hiring of a new Executive Director. Chris Jones began working at the end of June and has spent the summer becoming acquainted with the policies, procedures, and individuals that are part of our organization.

Chris has settled in just as the demand for our services has significantly increased. As a vital source of assistance for seniors, many of our activities are returning to pre-pandemic levels. The office is buzzing with calls for transportation. To this end, we have hired a second driver, Drew Burke, allowing us to have both of our vehicles on the roads simultaneously.

In addition, we are once again offering transportation on Fridays from 9 AM until 1 PM. While rides to medical appointments remain a priority, completing errands and attending social events is vitally important for alleviating both loneliness and stress. Our goal is to provide a safety net, so that Darien seniors will remain connected to the community.

This issue of **Out & About** includes brief introductions to some of our favorite individuals. We have profiled people who use our services, staff members, supporters, board members and volunteers. Their stories illustrate a community network that bespeaks strength and satisfaction, offering insight into the many ways that we are working to assist local seniors.

Finally, on Thursday, September 29th we will host our second Sip 'n Shop with J. McLaughlin's Darien store. Fifteen percent of all purchases that day will be donated to **At Home In Darien**. Please stop by to shop and mingle with other supporters as you enhance your fall wardrobe. On Thursday, November 3 we will resume our annual Fall Luncheon, in conjunction with the DCA. This event is open to all Darien seniors, free of charge, for lunch and a talk by Allia Zobel Nolan. 

**David** has utilized **At Home** In Darien's transportation and Vetted Service Provider (VSP) programs for several years. A Darien resident since 1973, David has impacted the town and its residents through a wide range of unique initiatives. He was responsible for acquiring the Caboose from the old Victoria Station restaurant and bringing it to the Depot Youth Center where it remains in use today. He was also one of the pioneers that created Darien TV79, the town's own government and community television station. During his sales career David had the distinction of working for a British company and being the first representative to sell digital television technology in the United States. In addition to being an electronics enthusiast, David also enjoys sailing and boating off the coasts of Darien and Maine.

**Cris'** efforts in supporting the **At Home In Darien** mission as a volunteer shopper for the past five years align with her background volunteering at local schools and various clubs for her four children. Cris has a particular fondness for her work with **At Home In Darien** and says that she enjoys "helping the seniors because I know it makes a big difference in their day." While COVID impacted her ability to volunteer, she is happy to again be able to give her time to help the community and its seniors. She has used our transportation services in addition to our Vetted Service Provider (VSP) referral program where she was able to connect with a "fabulous" plumber. **Sally** was already familiar with **At Home In Darien** when she joined the staff in January of this year, having been a volunteer shopper and visitor for the previous two years. She in fact shares that it was her passionate support of the mission that influenced her decision to join the office team! Now also the organization's bookkeeper, she is firmly entrenched in the day to day activities of the office, and says "it's such a pleasure to work here — everyone wants to go that extra mile to help a senior out". If you have ever spoken to Sally on the phone, you may have caught that hint of a British accent! Growing up in the U.K. she earned a B.Sc. from Reading University and later qualified as a Chartered Accountant with Price Waterhouse, pivoting into a long career in Financial Services which finally took her to the US over 20 years ago. When Sally retired from the financial services industry a few years ago, she enjoyed expanding her volunteer commitment to various non-profit organizations within the local Darien community, including the Darien Scouts, Andrew Shaw Memorial Trust, Person to Person, Saint Luke's Parish, and of course At Home In Darien. In her spare time when not spending time with her husband, son and 2 dogs, or volunteering, she enjoys gardening, cooking and drinking cups of tea!

Like many of our riders, **Betsy** is a longterm Darien resident, having moved here in the early 1960's. Prior to Darien, she had lived in a number of other cities including Charlottesville, Virginia, Gross Pointe, Michigan, and Litchfield, Connecticut — which she believes was actually colder than Michigan! Betsy has been involved in a number of volunteer activities in Darien, and considers the 15+ years that she spent volunteering for the local Family & Children's Agency to be among the most rewarding, as it impacted such a wide range of people in Fairfield County. While still an active driver, Betsy has utilized At Home In Darien's ride service to bring her to visits and appointments beyond Darien. She says that Darien has always been kind to its seniors and **At Home In Darien** has been "a tremendous help and I've never had to worry about anything" when utilizing its services. Betsy has three children, including one living in Darien and the other two in Boston and London.





Over three years ago, **Michael** decided that he wanted to get more involved in volunteer work and was pointed in the direction of **At Home In Darien**. He has been a key part of our volunteer team ever since and believes it is a "very valuable organization and volunteering is something that I really love to do." A resident of Darien for over 45 years and with a background working at Johnson & Johnson, Michael also maintains a love of playing the guitar and piano. #### At Home In Darien...

#### **Use your IRA to make a donation and reduce your taxes**

Individuals with certain IRA accounts and 401(K)s must begin withdrawals the year they turn 72 years of age. Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) must be made that year and every year thereafter, and are taxed as ordinary income and must be taken to avoid a penalty. Transferring money from your IRA to a qualifying charity (in lieu of taking an RMD) can be a tax efficient way of meeting your charitable giving objectives and is known as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).
